**Protest Filing:** To be considered valid, protests must be filed by either a landowner or a registered voter within the divestiture/formation area. The protest must be signed and dated, must state whether it is made by a landowner or a registered voter or both and must include protestor's name and address. An Assessor's Parcel Number identifying land location is acceptable for a landowner. A registered voter's protest must show name and address appearing on the affidavit of registration. Written protest forms are available at the LAFCo office and online at [shastalafco.org/applications/current-projects](http://shastalafco.org/applications/current-projects). Use of the form is encouraged, but not required.

Protests may either be mailed to Shasta LAFCo at 999 Mission De Oro Drive, Suite 106 Redding, CA 96003, emailed to the LAFCo Executive Officer ([eo@shastalafco.org](mailto:eo@shastalafco.org)), or hand-delivered at the protest hearing. Only written protests that are received prior to the end of the hearing on November 29, 2022, will be accepted as timely.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Shasta Local Agency Formation Commission (“LAFCO”) Executive Officer will hold two public hearings as described above on Tuesday, November 29, 2022, at 4:00PM at Shasta CSD Fire Station #56 located at 10644 High St, Shasta, CA 96087, to receive oral and written protests for the Shasta CSD divestiture and successor agency designation (Hearing # 1) and the Shasta Fire Protection District (FPD) formation (Hearing # 2). These public hearings will be conducted by the Commission’s Executive Officer who has been delegated hearing authority. The agenda will be posted on the LAFCO website at least 72 hours before the scheduled hearing start time.

The purpose of the hearings is for LAFCo to receive written protests from affected landowners and registered voters within the approved Shasta CSD divestiture and Shasta FPD formation area. The Commission approved the CSD divestiture/successor agency designation on October 6, 2022, by Resolution No. 22-08, and the Shasta FPD formation on October 6, 2022, by Resolution No. 22-14 subject to conducting hearings to receive any written protests filed against the Commission’s action. Protest hearings are typically conducted to determine whether proposals would be confirmed, terminated, or subject to an election based on the number of valid protests received.

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For the first hearing, if the CSD divestiture/successor agency designation receives 50% or more voter protest, it will be terminated and the second hearing will be cancelled. For the second hearing, since the FPD formation is already subject to an election for majority voter approval and election of new district board directors, only the protest threshold for termination is applicable: (Government Code Section 57075(a):

*Terminate formation proceedings if written protests received from 50% or more of voters residing in the territory.*

Proceedings for district divestiture of fire services were initiated by Shasta CSD Board Resolution. The Shasta FPD formation was initiated by petition of registered voters in the proposed district boundaries. The proposed divestiture/ formation area is approximately 7,207 acres currently served by the Shasta CSD. Reasons for the proposed divestiture and FPD formation are to sustain and improve local emergency medical and fire services response. The FPD, if formed, would be eligible for grant funding and tax revenue available only to local government entities. The FPD would be governed by an elected three-member Board of Directors.
